When to keep your child home from school:

- 1. Fever of 100.4 degrees F
- 2. Vomiting and/or diarrhea
- 3. Drainage from the eye

Varicella: Physician documentation of disease history, including morth and year, is groof of immunity for children entering preschool through 12° grade. Parent report of disease history is not acceptable.

Tdap: There is no minimum interval from the last Td does.

MCMs: individuals who receive does 1 on or after MCMs: individuals who receive does 1 on or after

MCM4: Individuals who receive dose 1 on or after the 16th birthday only need 1 dose of MCM4. Hepatitis A: The minimum interval between 1st and 2st dose is 6 calendar months. 2 doses are required for all grades Pre-K through 12. How Sick is Too Sick?

This information sheet was designed by the Indiana Department of Education to be used as general guidance. If you have a medical question, please consult your school nurse or physician.

Symptom	Send to School	Keep at Home
Fever	During the past 24 hours, the student's temperature has been below 100 degrees and no fever reducing medication has been taken.	During the past 24 hours, the student's temperature has been more than 100.4 F.
Vomiting	During the past 24 hours, no vomiting has occurred.	During the past 24 hours, vomiting has occurred.
Diarrhea	During the past 24 hours, no diarrhea has occurred.	During the past 24 hours, more than one watery stool has occurred.
Eyes	Eyes may be itchy, but are not red, crusty, or draining.	Eyes are pink, draining, crusty, itching, painful, sensitive to light, or student has vision changes
Cough/ Runny Nose	Slight cough or runny nose, but no fever, and the student is able to cover cough, blow nose, and wash hands	Symptoms are severe enough that the student is unable to learn. The student has a fever, or is unable to cover cough, blow nose, or wash hands
Rash	Rash is not draining or spreading. The student does not have a fever, and symptoms of itching are not severe enough to impede learning.	Rash is bothersome and distracting. The student has a fever or severe itching, or rash is spreading or draining

COVID-19 Guidelines:

IF YOUR STUDENT TESTS POSITIVE for COVID-19, keep he/she home from school & isolate them from others for 5 days. Return to school on day 6; mask days 6-10. Don't forget to notify your school attendance clerk!

If your student was **exposed to someone with COVID-19**; observe for symptoms. **Continue to send them to school as long as they remain asymptomatic.**

Calculating Isolation: Day 0 is your first day of symptoms or a positive test. Day 1 is the first full day after your symptoms developed.
