

Madison Consolidated Schools COVID-19 UPDATE

Updated: 11/10/2021

MCS follows guidance from Centers for Disease Control, the Indiana State Department of Health, the Jefferson County Department of Health and the Indiana Department of Education. Information regarding COVID-19 has been fluid and guidance continues to change. The contents of this document may be updated frequently.

FACE COVERINGS

- Masks are mandatory for all students, staff, and volunteers within the buildings at all times; regardless of vaccination status.
- If individuals are outside and can maintain 6 feet of physical distance, masks may be removed
- Masks are required on the school bus in accordance with federal mandate.
- Face Shields may be worn in addition to a mask, but do NOT fulfill the mask requirement when worn alone.
- If wearing a mask has been deemed a hazard to your health, please contact your physician and obtain a doctor's order. Documentation must be provided to wear a face shield in place of a mask.
- Students who wear face shields will not be exempt from quarantine. If a student wearing
 a face shield tests positive for COVID-19, every student within a 6 foot radius must
 quarantine.
- Exemptions and reasonable accommodations will be made in accordance with <u>CDC</u>
 <u>Guidelines.</u>

MASKED CLOSE CONTACT AND QUARANTINE PROTOCOL (masked classroom and bus)

- Contact tracing will still be performed for all positive cases.
- Close contact is defined as any individual within 3 feet of the positive person for a cumulative total of 15 minutes or more
- Individuals correctly and consistently wearing a well fitting mask do not have to quarantine if identified as a close contact in the classroom setting per Executive Order 21-24, unless symptomatic.
- Parents of students identified as close contacts will be notified to monitor for symptoms for 14 days and may remain at school with enhanced precautions.

Enhanced Precautions Clarification*

 If ANY signs or symptoms are identified while at home, student/teacher/staff should NOT come to school and should get tested.

- If symptoms develop during the school day, individual should go home as soon as possible and get tested.
- If COVID-19 test is positive, begin 10 days of isolation starting from the date symptoms began.
- If COVID-19 test is negative because an individual is identified as a close contact and has symptoms, he or she must complete the remaining days of quarantine.
 Must also be free of symptoms and fever for at least 24 hours without the use of fever-reducing medication before returning to school.

UNMASKED CLOSE CONTACT AND QUARANTINE PROTOCOL (non-classroom)

- In a setting where **anyone is unmasked**, a close contact is defined as any individual within 6 feet of the positive person for a cumulative total of 15 minutes or more.
- Non-classroom is defined as: breakfast/lunch, indoor recess, athletics, extracurricular activities, classes where students are not masked, on or off school grounds.
- If students remove their masks for any reason in the classroom setting such as "mask breaks" or "snack time," the unmasked protocol guidance will be followed for contact tracing and quarantine purposes.
- All unvaccinated individuals must quarantine with one of the following options and remain asymptomatic:
 - Quarantine for 10 days (no test needed). Return on day 11.
 - Quarantine for 7 days. Return on day 8. Must provide documentation of negative PCR or antigen (rapid) COVID test performed on days 5, 6, or 7. No exceptions. Continue enhanced precautions on days 8-14*
- Symptomatic close contacts, regardless of vaccination status, must complete their 10 day isolation from onset of symptoms. If symptoms resolve, they may return on day 11.
- Fully Vaccinated individuals DO NOT NEED TO QUARANTINE in any situation, unless they become symptomatic.
- Individuals with documentation of positive COVID-19 test in the past 90 days may be exempt from quarantine

IMPORTANT INFORMATION

HOME TESTS

- Following guidance of the Indiana Department of Health, MCS will **NOT accept or act** on any results of in-home tests (positive or negative).
- Anyone who has a positive home test should isolate and seek testing at a clinical site
 - If positive, that test will be entered into the system, included in the case count and contact traced.
 - Students must provide documentation of a positive test to qualify for the 90 day quarantine exemption

VACCINATION

- Pfizer vaccine is approved for ages 5 and up. Click <u>here</u> HERE for vaccination information and to schedule an appointment.
- If your student is vaccinated, please submit documentation to your school nurse. If you
 do not have documentation, we can verify your student's vaccination status through
 CHIRP. Please alert your school nurse to verify documentation.

EXTENDED QUARANTINE FOR HOUSEHOLD MEMBERS

- COVID-19 Quarantine and Isolation Includes FAQ and clarification for household contacts. If separation of the person with COVID-19 from others in the home is not possible, the other members of the household will have *ongoing* exposure, meaning they will be repeatedly exposed until that person is no longer able to spread the virus to other people.
- People with COVID-19 can spread the virus to other people for 10 days after they
 develop symptoms, or 10 days from the date of their positive test if they do not have
 symptoms.
- The household members will begin their quarantine after the positive person's isolation period. Please contact your school nurse for help with your quarantine dates.
