Upon the recommendation of Dr. Studebaker-Bolinger and a motion by Mr. Glesing, seconded by Mr. Kring, the Board voted, 5-0, and the motion carried to approve Mr. Jason Pattison as Primary Attorney and the new rate \$100.00 an hour for extraordinary services.

FIRST READING – REVISION OF MCS POLICY

Dr. Studebaker-Bolinger presented revisions of MCS Policy 0167.3, letter I for the first reading.

APPROVAL OF ASSESSMENTS PLAN FOR MCS

Upon the recommendation of Dr. Studebaker-Bolinger and a motion by Mrs. laCour, seconded by Mrs. L. Imel, the Board voted, 5-0, and the motion carried to approve the Assessment Plans for MCS.

Dr. Studebaker-Bolinger gave an overview:

Madison Consolidated Schools evaluation does not have Student Learning Objectives (SLOs) directly tied to Social Studies data, therefore, in order to further reduce student testing time, MCS students in grades 5 and 7 will not take the Social Studies Part 2 ISTEP+. In an announcement from Karen Stein, Special Programs Assessment Specialist, on March 2, 2015, Social Studies will not be included in ISTAR if not included in ISTEP+.

Biology 1 – all students (MJHS and MCHS) taking Biology 1 will complete the Spring 2015 Biology 1 ECA; *taking* the Biology 1 ECA after the course completion remains an Indiana graduation requirement.

Algebra 1 – all students taking Algebra 1 in grade 9-12, who have not yet taken and/or passed the Algebra 1 ECA, will complete the Spring 2015 Algebra 1 ECA. MJHS students will not take the Algebra 1 ECA and will focus time on preparing for the ISTEP+; *passing* the Algebra 1 ECA is an Indiana graduation requirement for current high school students; however, the Algebra 1 ECA will ultimately be replaced by ISTEP+ 9 and 10.

English 10 – all students taking English 10, who have not yet taken and/or passed the English 10 ECA, will complete the Spring 2015 English 10 ECA; passing the English 10 ECA is an Indiana graduation requirement for current high school students; however, the English 10 ECA will ultimately be replaced by ISTEP+ 9 and 10.

Alternate Assessments – students in grade 10 who have been determined by their case conference committee to meet the criteria for alternate assessment will participate in NCSC/ISTAR-ELA, Math and Science.

Mr. Kring asked how many companies had sent proposals? Mr. Miller said he had three and had talked to another firm. Mr. Kring asked how many of those had Mr. Miller worked with. He said one.

Mrs. J. Imel asked about the on-site support staff and help desk requests. Mr. Miller said they would remote online first but are there to fix the problems.

Mrs. J. Imel said the proposals are due March 27th.

Mr. Miller said we would no longer have an IT department but would need someone to oversee and monitor reports. Dr. Studebaker-Bolinger said there is a possibility of having a director on a reduced contract as state reporting must be done. Mr. Glesing asked if Mr. Miller was comfortable with one person. Mr. Miller said yes as there are back up staff that can fill in.

Dr. Studebaker-Bolinger said we would still need the technology coaches. Mr. Miller said it is a bad idea to outsource coaches.

Mrs. laCour asked if our current staff could be hired by the company. Mr. Miller said yes we have current staff who have institutional knowledge but there are no guarantees. He said in most situations the corporation can sit in during the hiring.

Mr. Kring said he was worried about our employees.

FACILITIES UPDATE – MR. MIKE FRAZIER

Mr. Frazier reported:

- 1) Junior High locker room renovation
 - Working on getting costs lower
- 2) Security Systems
 - Use CPF funds (won't be all inclusive)
 - o Bond (secure entrances, doors, lighting, cameras, change lock systems)
- 3) High School Renovation
 - o Demolish B & E wing (tear down 22 rooms can operate) (handicap accessible restrooms)
 - o Reroof and new HVAC system

Mr. Frazier said if the B & E wing were demolished it would save on utility costs, maintenance and custodial costs. He added at some point buildings need to be upgraded.

Mr. Frazier said bonds could be used for the high school renovations and security upgrades, and use Capital Project money for the other buildings.

Mr. Frazier said a community group, parent group and teacher group needs to be formed to discuss a 5th grade move to the Junior High. He said he met with Principal Jill Mires and the 5th and 6th graders could be isolated from the 7th and 8th grade. Mr. Frazier said parents are concerned about the 5th graders getting along with 8th graders. He said the students ride the school bus and attend sporting events together. Mr. Frazier said it is a possibility for the classes be self-contained.

Mrs. laCour asked where the high school students would go during renovations. Mr. Frazier said the media center would move to the old small gym area. Mrs. laCour said she didn't like portables. Mr. Frazier said he didn't want to disrupt the students. Dr. Jenner said approximately 144 students would attend Ivy Tech for part of the day next school year.

Mr. Kring asked if it was possible to remodel the high school. Mr. Frazier said it was possible. Dr. Studebaker-Bolinger said the high school building is too large. She said we have lost 600 students in the past 10 years. Mrs. laCour said most all school systems are losing students.

A discussion ensued regarding secured entryways. Mr. Frazier said Mr. Kevin Yancey, High School Principal, is working on purchasing a new camera system that will alert the office if there is an open door. He said we need to make the facilities secure. Dr. Studebaker-Bolinger said Mr. Victor Hellman is working on a facility security audit.

Dr. Studebaker-Bolinger said per the 2015 approved budget \$150,000 would be used from the General Obligation bond to repair the junior high locker rooms. She said after the security audit she would seek approval from the board to proceed with a bond. Mr. Glesing asked when these items would occur. Dr. Studebaker-Bolinger said some projects would begin this summer but the 5th grade move may take longer. Mr. Frazier said there is a process that must be followed. He hopes the security project could begin this summer.

Mr. Kring asked if there are sewer issues. Mr. Frazier said yes.

Mrs. L. Imel asked if other options could be discussed regarding E.O. Muncie and possibly not move the 5th grade. Mr. Frazier said E.O. Muncie is a problem. He said there are 10+ empty rooms at the Junior High. He said those rooms are heated and cooled every day. Mrs. L. Imel suggested a small referendum and redoing E.O. Muncie. Mrs. laCour said she doesn't like the idea of moving the 5th grade. Mr. Frazier said it would be a cost efficient measure and the Junior High is a better facility.

Mr. Kring asked what 5253 Design Group was doing. Mr. Frazier said they were preparing a cost analysis.

Mr. Glesing said he is thrilled with our student participation and successes.

Mrs. laCour thanked those in the audience and encouraged them to attend student events.

Mr. Kring said what an awesome display of engineering.

Mr. Kring congratulated the bowling team and the coaches who support the team.

Mr. Kring said he hopes all is going well with ISTEP+

Mrs. J. Imel said the Indiana School Boards Association is recommending boards give monthly updates on legislative issues to their community. She said Mr. Glesing and Mr. Kring would begin this at the April meeting as they are the appointed legislative liaisons for the board.

Mrs. J. Imel welcomed Mr. Pattison.
