

Madison Consolidated Schools Special Education

The provision of special education requires the planned and purposeful coordination of many disciplines. Madison Consolidated Schools shall provide for the location, identification, and evaluation of all students at least three (3) years of age but less than twenty-two (22) years of age, who are in need of special education and related services, regardless of the severity of their disabilities.

To that end, our special education staff includes:

- Mild and intense intervention teachers
- Instructional support personnel
- Hearing and vision specialists
- Speech, occupational, and physical therapists
- IEP specialists
- School psychologist
- Educational diagnostician
- Nurses
- Special education clerks

Madison Consolidated Schools shall provide a free and appropriate public education ("FAPE") to all students who are identified as a student with a disability in any of the following eligibility categories:

- Autism spectrum disorder
- Blind/low vision
- Cognitive disability
- Deaf/blind
- Deaf/hard of hearing
- Developmental delay
- Emotional disability
- Language impairment
- Multiple disabilities
- Orthopedic impairment
- Other health impairment
- Specific learning disability
- Speech impairment
- Traumatic brain injury
